Did the Bop gave sent
to me the Sunday after
Christmas which every thing
that gave made mention
of was in it But not
packing it tight up to
Did every thing was back
Except one bottle of gin
and the Buckle the Mate
was very good I'm dead
went as soon as gave
got this Letter and let
me know how times is
don't get busy we were
not paid as yet but
by the time ^{we} I will get
the ans^r of this I will
have my money to send to
Welp. The Little ones
over the cold weather

This is not much
news here at present
all the Regt is put
up for winter quarters
Give my Love to
my Father and Family
and Martin and
Mary Kegan and to
my Aunty and Family and
Patrick Tarphy and
Family and Tell
Michael Tarphy that
I will go home to him
I Patrick got with him
Remember me to the
Children No more
At present from
Your Husband
