Thurs. Morn
Dear wife

I rec^d. a letter
from you a few days
ago stating that the
children had the chineas
which I am very sorry for
them I thought the war
over at since last fall
but with the help of
God it will not amount
to much loss for it must
be on decline also you
had mentioned about a
Receipt of 10 dollars which
you got I do not know any
thing about 10 dollars for
it is 15 dollars which
I sent home and if you

Don't get it writen as
quick as you can and
I shall have it put on
the next pay roll for expect
to be paid the last of this
month I have and all
the letters which you
sent me but I think think
that the all dont go for
I see a good many copies
of this letter I also want
to let you know that I
am well and do good health
At present thank the Lord
for it the weather is very
hot for at present which
is the only thing that
trouble us I suppose you
have heard of the Battle
which held for 3 days
The paper I suppose gives
all particulars about it

Dear wife I feel very
glad that your Brother
John is landed and I hope
that I will have the pleasure
of his company some time
or other I live through
this war I hope it will
be over coming on the fall
as soon as you get this
letter get Brother John to
put up a small box and
send it to me tell him
put 1 gal of whiskey in
1 gal of g^og. which it is the
safest place to put and
send me a towel and 2 pocket
handkerchiefs and that will
be all I want except
if you think that your
Bark has to stand some
time for I have not got
any soft bark for 6 months

Dear wife I hope you
will not feel uneasy
about me take all the
care you can of the children
and remember me to them
and tell Martha that I will
send her a present next pay
day Give give my love to
Martin and John and all
the Keyser girls no more
at present from your
affectionate husband
