Dear wife and
children I rec'd your letter
on the first of the month
which gives me great pleasure
to hear the children were
in good health as this leaves
me you at present thanks be
to god for his mercy to us all
I hope mary and Martha will
be improving in this cold
be sure to keep good shoes
and clothe on them for this
winter for I hope to see them
by you with the help of god

Have not much to you
At present Every thing
Is quite slow here as yet
Except the vessels going up
and down the river the
Stand in danger for the
Ripples was very strong
Battery on the Virginia Side
there is no danger of their
Ball or shell Reaching us
our Camp 2 miles from the
River and the River is $1\frac{1}{3}$
wide but there is one camp
out of the Regt^t ^{any} goes down
on their turn and stops
24 on precipice that is
the Hardest work we have
to do for the night is
very cold & long the bank
of the river for there is
nearly nothing to be seen
But water

I Am afraid I few Lays
In the Last Letter you
Smt me making mention
of some Articles you had
to send out to me for the
winter This is the season
I did write those few Lays
for I should not write so
swoon only to spare you the
trouble for getting any thing
up for me and I am much
obliged I should be very
happy to have a Christmas
present from Mary but its
too inconvenient but with
the help of god I will send
her a nice years gift Let
me know how much money
you get from the City or
do you get it Study an
for Let me know in
the answer of this

I Expected to get a letter from
Patt this week I wrote to him
last week and sent him
2 news papers let me know
if he got them and tell
him to write as soon as
he can It is snowing here
to day with very hard
north wind to it
