If we move from this camp
we are far now it makes
no matter for the letters
Directed to 11 Sept well
come to us dear wife
you will excuse me for
those few goynes for not
I have not much to say
at present but I feel
Happy that ye are all in
good health my husband
not come from Washington
as yet but they now will
be able to go home to see
ye on March 3^d the war
is not settled I think
now that we will be
all home & court July

Dear wife you will
mind to send any —
refreshment out to me
for it would be to much
trouble for you and also
its very hard to get any
thing up when we are for
the roads is very bad our
teams can not go to Landis
and only for the last 90 day
provision up here before the
weather broke we should
be very short now we
have enough to do us till
the first of March there
is 25000 men here on this
front which we dont know
the minute or hour we
will leave hear no word
at present from your
loving Husband to Sally
